



Academic-related grants (all students)

The College has a number of funds to support students in their academic work and would like to encourage graduates and undergraduates to apply for awards from these funds. As well as awarding grants for projects relating to the fulfilment of course requirements (e.g. field trips), the Loans & Grants Committee would like to provide support for focused projects that might fall outside the strict requirements of a course, but which will enhance an applicant's understanding of their field of study e.g. conference attendance.

Please note: Books purchased with a grant award (excepting the Freshers' Book Fund) must be donated to the College Library once the student has graduated.

Holbrooke and Rogers Funds for Classics students

Who can apply?

Undergraduates reading for Classical Mods, Lit. Hum, CAAH, Classics & Oriental Studies, Classics & Modern Languages, Classics & English, Ancient & Modern History, and graduates reading for a degree with a classical content. Applications are encouraged from those whose studies have caused or will cause them in the near future to incur extraordinary costs, for example in attending one of the various courses that are recommended to appropriate individuals, e.g. the JACT Greek Summer School, or at the British School at Rome or Athens. Others might make a case for help with book purchases, or with travel to attend conferences, or to visit libraries, museums, or ancient sites. Future members of the college will be notified of successful applications but the awards will be paid only on matriculation.

Who can apply?

Undergraduates and Graduates studying any subject, towards a project in one of the subject areas above (including but not restricted to the study of religion, history, literature and art).

Money available: Maximum award £325 per student towards any costs, for example study, research, and travel. The piece of work or research does not need to be related to your course of study, but should be of academic merit
